

## University Headlines

- 594,490 university applications by main 31<sup>st</sup> January 2024 UCAS deadline
- 41.3% of all UK 18 year-olds applied to HE
- Applicants from outside the EU is stable with 98,840 applying to study at university in the UK
- EU applicants to UK universities has continued to fall
- Current graduate job market is in flux
- Average graduate starting salary varies by subject
- Net financial gain from a degree over lifetime

#### Key dates - 2024

- UCAS opens for applications to be submitted in September 2023
- 15 October 2023: Deadline for applications to Oxford,
   Cambridge and most courses in medicine, dentistry,
   and veterinary medicine/science
- January 2024: Deadline for applications for most other courses
- May 2024: Universities deadline to respond to applicants
- June 2024: Applicant deadline to respond to offers
- July 2024: Clearing opens







#### **Student Finance**

#### 2 main costs

- Tuition fees
- Living costs Maintenance

Support is provided by the Student Loans Company aka. Student Finance England





#### **Tuition fee loan**

- Available to all UK students on a full-time, undergraduate course
- Not income assessed loan covers the full fee
- Paid directly to the University
- There is nothing to pay before or during the course







#### **Maintenance loan**

- Available to all UK students on a full-time, undergraduate course
- Paid directly to the student in 3 instalments
- What you get depends on 2 factors:
- Your household income and;
- Where you study

# Apprenticeships Suffolk

**#BuildTheFuture #BeSuffolksFuture**  Supports businesses in Suffolk to create apprenticeship opportunities.

Liaise with Training provider to support with course delivery

Provide information, advice and guidance to education settings.



Signpost to services and opportunities that best suit your needs.



Support both employer and apprentice throughout the apprenticeship journey.

Support individuals 16+ who are ready to explore their next steps.

### What is an apprenticeship?

Earn while you are learning! Many companies offer great perks too!!

Transferable Skills to take with you across your working life.

Employed to do a real fulltime job whilst studying for a real qualification. (6 hours of your working week)

Gaining and demonstrating knowledge, skills and behaviours and being fully trained in that job role.

Apprenticeships take 1 to 5 years to complete depending on the level.

Progression onto another apprenticeship or a pathway into a future career. Many Managers and Owners were Apprentices.

Apprenticeships are for those 16+ and available for anyone at any level.

#### **End Point Assessments**

What is an End Point assessment?

End-point assessment (EPA) is the final stage of an apprenticeship. It is an impartial assessment of whether your apprentice has developed the skills, knowledge and behaviours outlined in the apprenticeship standard.

What is the process?

Each apprenticeship includes an end-point assessment plan which describes how the apprentice should be tested against the appropriate criteria. For example, you apprentice may need to complete:

- •a practical assessment
- an interview
- •a project
- •written and/or multiple-choice tests
- •a presentation

What happens after?

If your apprentice successfully completes their apprenticeship and passes their assessment, they'll be awarded with a certificate.

## **Maths and English**

Not achieved a pass (Grade 4 or C) in Maths and English GCSE

You may need to complete a Functional skills as part of your apprenticeship.

Your Training
Provider or College
will identify what
level you are
working at through
an initial
assessment.

For Level 2
apprenticeships, you will be required to have at least a Level 1
Functional Skills
Maths and English.



Level 1 Functional Skills is equivalent to GCSE grades 1 to 3

(D to G in old GCSE grading system)



For a Level 3 to 7
apprenticeship,
you will be working
towards a Level 2
Functional Skills
alongside your
apprenticeship.



Level 2 Functional Skills is equivalent to GCSE grades 4-9 (C to A in old GCSE grading system)

## **Apprenticeship Levels:**

## Level 6 & 7 (Higher Degree Apprenticeships)

Equivalent to a full degree (6) or a Masters Degree (7) Currently around 200 standards

#### **Level 4 & 5 (Higher Apprenticeships)**

Equivalent to foundation degree level Currently around 180 standards

#### Level 3 (Advanced Apprenticeship)

Equivalent to 2 A-levels
Currently around 280 standards

#### **Level 2 (Intermediate Apprenticeship)**

Equivalent to 5 GCSE's 4 – 9 Currently around 170 standards You can find all of the apprenticeship standards approved for delivery on the




