A fabulous group of students in years 7-10 played Matilda's group of friends. William in year 8 gave a comical turn as Bruce who had to stuff his face with chocolate cake and Emma in year 9 gave a very sweet performance as Amanda, the girl who Trunchbull throws out of the window by her pigtails! Both Ysabel and Isabelle played Lavender and Big Kids alternatively and did a fabulous job of making Matilda 'their very best friend' as well as dropping a newt into Trunchbull's water jug. Oh how we laughed when the newt headed north into Trunchbull's knickers! Several of our students were in the Big Kid



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ensemble belting out songs such as 'Revolting Children' and 'School Song'. We also had a lovely cast of little kids who performed two shows each. Tuesday and Thursday was the turn of the Bambinatum Maggots and Wednesday and Friday meant it was the turn of the Trunchbull Toads.

Rehearsals were held once a week for full cast on Tuesdays after school, along with smaller group rehearsals for principals/



singers or dancers on other days. Staff have worked really hard to put the show together. Miss Patrick choreographed the energetic numbers with style and Mrs Eden directed the dialogue giving the cast fantastic ideas for characterisations. Miss Jacobs was a stage manager and worked hard on putting together a team of students to operate her lighting design and her various prop ideas. The set was hired in from LX Pro using an idea that Miss Tournay-Godfrey had for letters/alphabet blocks over the stage that could light up in time to some of the musical numbers. The backstage crew were invaluable this year and it was a great opportunity to

get involved with props, scenery, lighting and sound. Mrs Rutter took responsibility for costumes this year and did a great job in making the cast look incredible on stage. Thank you to Mrs Rutter, Mrs Baxter and Mrs Pycock who assisted in chaperoning our students when in the dressing rooms. A huge thank you also to Mr Pettitt who operated the sound desk, supporting two of our students on how to use radio mics and to balance out the sound of the vocals and dialogue.

Three of our year 13s did an amazing job front of house giving out programmes and selling raffle tickets in aid of Papyrus. Thank you to Grace, Annika and Flo. This charity is instrumental in promoting





positive well-being in young people and supporting strong emotional health. At Northgate we take huge pride in the happiness and wellbeing of our students and we could not think of a more appropriate charity.
